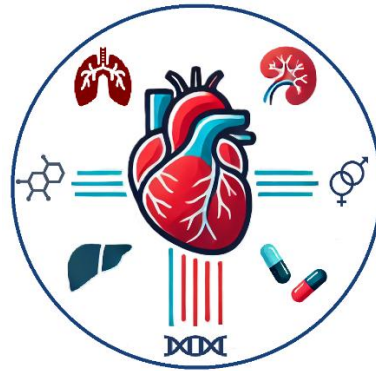

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GENERAL

This call uses a two-step submission procedure (pre-proposals and full proposals), including a rebuttal stage.

All proposals must be written in English and submitted exclusively by using the PT-Outline electronic submission system (<https://ptoutline.eu/app/era4healthinterheart>), and this before March 7th, 2025 for the pre-proposals and before the June 17th, 2025 for the full proposals.

It is recommended to carefully read the call text prior to starting an application.

The project duration is 36 months.

ELIGIBILITY

Before participating to a consortium, principal investigators (PI) should self-assure that their organisation is eligible for funding by one of the funding organisations participating in the call. The funding rules of each funding organisation participating to the call are available in the Annex I of the call text.

After the deadline, the funding organisations will review the composition of the consortia to make sure that each partner applying to get funding from them is following the national/ regional funding rules. Only pre-proposals from consortia that have been deemed eligible will be sent to the reviewers for scientific evaluation. The scientific evaluation will be coordinated by the joint call secretariat on behalf of all participating funding organisations.

The table below shows the eligibility criteria of each funding organization participating to the call:

Applicants to F.R.S.-FNRS funding must provide basic administrative data by submitting an administrative application on e-space within 5 working days after the general deadline of the ERA4Health JTC6 call to be eligible.

No more than two Italian PIs (Principal Investigators) are eligible to apply for the same project.</p> <p>Italian PAOs can be funded as a sub-contractor of an IRCCS if they fulfil the eligibility criteria of the EC. This is especially encouraged when there are for profit companies from other countries in the consortium or for projects coordinated by Spanish PIs.</p> <p>Eligibility criteria for PIs</p> <p>The Spanish Principal Investigators (PIs) must hold a PhD degree.</p> <p>PIs must be eligible according to the general requirements of PCI2024-2 call and must have experience as investigators (not necessarily as PIs) in projects funded by any of the National Plans of I+D+i from 2013 onwards, ERC Grants, European Framework Programmes or other relevant national or international programmes.</p> <p>Incompatibilities (these must be considered when participating in different ERA-Nets or other international initiatives):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ PIs will not be eligible for funding if they apply as PIs to more than one proposal in this transnational joint call, to more than one proposal in the same Spanish PCI call and/or to PCI calls of consecutive years. ○ If the same PI submits two or more proposals to the present call, all but one will be declared ineligible, without the possibility of future changes. ○ A PI that has been granted a PCI the previous year will be declared ineligible, without the possibility of changing the PI. ○ PIs must remain unchanged between the pre and full proposal of this transnational joint call, and the national PCI call. <p>The AEI will avoid double funding and will not grant projects or parts of projects already funded through other national or EU calls.</p>

COMPOSITION OF THE CONSORTIUM

Each consortium must have a coordinator, they will be the unique contact point of the Joint Call Secretariat during the application process.

Only transnational projects will be funded. The following conditions apply to the composition of consortia:

- A minimum of 3 (three) eligible and a maximum of 5 eligible partners from at least 3 different countries participating in the call.
- The maximum number of eligible partners can be increased up to 6 (six) or 7 (seven) if they include 1 or 2 partners, respectively, from the following participating countries: Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Slovakia, and Türkiye.
- No more than 2 eligible partners from the same country participating in the call will be accepted within one consortium.
- A maximum of 2 collaborators (self-funded) per consortium.

FUNDING MECHANISMS

Project partners will be funded by their relevant national/regional funding organisations. Eligible costs and funding rules vary between the respective funding organisations.

This total requested cost may never exceed the max. available amount of 350.000 EUR. • SBO: the sum of all costs (personnel, consumables, travel, subcontracting, etc.) amounts to 200.000 EUR, then the overhead will amount to 34.000 EUR (17% of 200.000 EUR) and the total requested cost is 234.000 EUR. This total requested cost may never exceed the max. available amount of 350.000 EUR. <p>The FWO funds up to pre-clinical research.</p>

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FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

[Composition of the consortium and eligibility of the partners](#)

- **My consortium has two partners from the same country but applying to different funding organisations, can we have another partner from the same country?**

No, the rule is a maximum of two partners from the same country, it does not matter what organisation they are applying to.

- **Can Postdoctoral fellows be principal investigators?**

This will depend on the funding organisation involved, you need to contact the national contact person (see annex I of the call text). You will very likely need a letter from the institution stating that the PI will stay at the institution during the whole duration of the projects.

- **Can non-tenure personal be principal investigator?**

This will depend on the funding organisation involved, you need to contact the national contact person (see annex I of the call text). You will very likely need a letter from the institution stating that the PI will stay at the institution during the whole duration of the projects.

- **Can Co-PI represent a partner?**

No, a single PI must represent the partner.

- **Can collaborators be eligible for funding but not want to apply as partners anyway?**

Yes, collaborators are self-funded partners. They can be eligible but not wanted to apply.

- **There are two partners from the same country in my consortium, can my collaborator come from that country as well?**

Yes, the collaborator does not count for the country rule

Proposal

- **Can I apply only to the second step of the call?**

No, your consortium must apply to the first step, i.e. submit a pre-proposal, to apply to this call. Depending on the eligibility and the scientific evaluation results of your pre-proposal, your consortium might be invited to submit a full proposal.

- **Do I need to follow the format of the pre-proposal template?**

Absolutely, you must keep the format as it is. All fields must be completed using "Arial font, size 11" characters; paper format: A4 with all margins minimum 1.27 cm.

- **Can we remove instructions from the proposal template?**

Please do not remove the instructions from the template.

- **Can additional figures be inserted?**

You can only add figures in the work plan, and you must still respect the maximal length for the section.

- **Can I add several CV for one partner?**

No, you must only add the CV of the PI who represent the partner respecting the format in the template.

- **Can supporting letters be added?**

No, extra material including letters of support are not allowed.

- **Who must sign the pre-proposal and the proposal, the Principal Investigator or the administrative representative of the partner?**

The principal investigator must sign the pre-proposal and proposal.

- **Do the collaborators need to fill the budget table?**

No, collaborators do not need to fill the budget table

- **What does in kind mean?**

In kinds means the funds you are bringing in the project but for which you are not requesting any funding from a participating funding organisation.

- **I do not have an account on PT-outline. How do I create one?**

When you are on the home page. On the right of the tab “login”, you have a tab “sign up” where you can enter your email address to receive a password.

- **Does the data of the collaborators need to be inserted to the submission platform?**

Yes, when you add a new partner, you tick if it is a partner applying for funding or a collaborator on its own funds. When you must select a funding organisation, you must then select “In kind”.

- **How do I add more partners on PT-Outline?**

You need to first save the first partner (by clicking save at the bottom of the page), then a butt “add a new partner will appear on top of the page.
